The initiative, unveiled at a high-profile event at the COP29 climate conference in Balu Azerbaijan, aims to position the country as a leader in carbon market development while advancing national commitments under the Paris Agreement. The new framework, developed in collaboration with international environmental experts and local stakeholders, provides a regulated platform for the development and trade of Article 6 compliant carbon credits.
